



STUDENT DRESS CODE

RIS students are expected to be appropriately dressed and groomed at all times.

APPEARANCE

- Excessive jewelry worn by girls or boys is unsuitable in the school setting. Boys are not allowed to wear earrings. Expensive jewelry and watches should not be worn to school, since they could be lost or stolen and could be a source of danger for students traveling on their own.
- Excessive make-up is considered inappropriate.
- Any hairstyle, which, in the opinion of the Administration, disrupts the educational atmosphere and/or detracts from the learning process, is unacceptable.

UNIFORM

- Except for “No Uniform Days,” school uniforms of the specified school colors are compulsory.
- Shirts must be properly buttoned, and shirts with long tails must be tucked in. Polo shirts need not be tucked in. Hemlines must be conservative. Clothing excessively large or small is unacceptable.
- All shirts must have the prescribed pocket with the school emblem on the left front side.
- Clean shoes/sneakers are to be worn, but rubber thongs, open-toed sandals, backless shoes, or shoes with more than one-inch heels are unacceptable.
- Caps or hats may be worn only at play and during P.E.
- Students may also wear jackets that are plain blue, black or white. However, these may not be used to entirely cover the uniform.
- P.E. uniforms are required for P.E. classes and for other specified occasions.

To ensure consistency, all uniform items must be purchased through the school from the Uniform Shop (Ad116). Items tailored or purchased outside the school are not acceptable.

APPEARANCE AND DRESS CODE FOR NO-UNIFORM DAYS

1. Shirts can not advertise alcohol or tobacco products nor contain obscene language.
2. Clothes, in general, should be appropriate for school wear. Students can not wear outfits that are skin tight or sleeveless, expose the midriff, or have very high hemlines or very low necklines.
3. Boys must wear shirts/trousers of suitable size and length.
4. Boys are not allowed to wear earrings. Excessive jewelry for either sex is not suitable.
5. Face paint and/or excessive makeup are not allowed.
6. Hairstyle must be simple, must not be longer than the shirt collar (for boys), and must not obstruct a clear view of the face.
7. Suitable shoes must be worn for appropriate appearance, comfort, and safety. No heavy platform shoes or boots are allowed.
8. Prescribed P.E. uniforms or any appropriate P.E. clothing and footwear may be worn during P.E. periods.
9. School ID must be worn and visible on No-Uniform Days.

NOTE

RIS students are the representatives of the school. If, in the opinion of the Faculty and/or Administration, a student’s grooming detracts from the decorum of the school, parents will be requested to make appropriate adjustments or disciplinary action will be taken.
